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
STUDYING THE BIBLE

- The New Testament is in the Old Testament concealed, while the Old Testament is in the New Testament revealed.






Overview of Opposing Mindsets

Hellenistic (Western)

- Focus on thought (thinking)
- Concerned with knowledge
- Ultimate concern is right thinking (CREED is No. 1)
- Extols intellectual virtues as the meaning of life
- End goal is intellectual man

Hebrew

- Focus on action (doing)
- Concerned with practice
- Ultimate concern is right conduct (<u>DEED</u> is No. 1)
- Extols the moral virtues as the meaning of life
- End goal is moral man








A Hebraic view of prophecy

- As Westerners when we think "prophecy" our minds seek prediction/fulfilment.
- Hebraic thought looks for patterns and then fulfilment through a repeat of the patterns.

The Bible is a book of patterns and models, as Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 10:6,11.

- ⁶ Now these things were our examples, to the intent we should not lust after evil things, as they also lusted.
- ⁷ Neither be ye idolaters, as were some of them; as it is written, The people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play.
- ⁸ Neither let us commit fornication, as some of them committed, and fell in one day three and twenty thousand.
- ⁹ Neither let us tempt Christ, as some of them also tempted, and were destroyed of serpents.
- ¹⁰ Neither murmur ye, as some of them also murmured, and were destroyed of the destroyer.
- ¹¹ Now all these things happened unto them for examples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come.

 1 Corinthians 10:6,11.

- Bible prophecies are mainly patterns (types).
- When we see a pattern (whether in the Bible or in our lives) we can better understand the consequences (good or bad) if we persist:
 - If the consequences are negative, repent!
 - If they are positive, persevere!
- This is why biblical prophecy is pattern.

- "The whole Bible, the New Testament as well as the Old Testament, is based on the Hebrew attitude and approach..." (Herring)
- The Hebrew attitude is that to know God is to revere God. To revere God is to listen. To listen is to act (responsive hearing), to obey.
- The most important text of Judaism begins with the call, 'Hear O'Israel'


