

Okay, but what IS the Gospel?


- ¹ Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand;




¹ Then He began to speak to them in parables: "A man planted a vineyard and set a hedge around it, dug a place for the wine vat and built a tower. And he leased it to vinedressers and went into a far country.

The vineyard was a national symbol for **Israel**.

Isaiah 5:1-7 Song of the Vineyard

Isaiah 5


- 1 Now will I sing to my wellbeloved a song of my beloved touching his vineyard. My wellbeloved hath a vineyard in a very fruitful hill:
- 2 And he fenced it, and gathered out the stones thereof, and planted it with the choicest vine, and built a tower in the midst of it, and also made a winepress therein: and he looked that it should bring forth grapes, and it brought forth wild grapes.
- ${\bf 3}$ And now, O inhabitants of Jerusalem, and men of Judah, judge, I pray you, betwixt me and my vineyard.


- ² Now at vintage-time he sent a servant to the vinedressers, that he might receive some of the fruit of the vineyard from the vinedressers. ³ And they took him and beat him and sent him away empty-handed.
- ⁴ "Again he sent them another servant, and at him they threw stones, wounded him in the head [per Wycliffe, "brake his head"], and sent him away shamefully treated. ⁵ "And again he sent another, and him they killed; and many others, beating some and killing some.
- ⁶ Therefore still having one son, his beloved, he also sent him to them last, saying, 'They will respect my son.'

⁷ But those vinedressers said among themselves, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him, and the inheritance will be ours.' ⁸ So they took him and killed him and cast him out of the vineyard.

Per Leviticus 19:23-35, the owner would not harvest fruit for five years; to retain legal rights to the field he had to receive produce from the tenants, even if just one vegetable.





⁹ Therefore what will the owner of the vineyard do?

He will come and destroy the vinedressers, and give the vineyard to others.


Prophetically fulfilled in AD 70 by Romans under Titus


- $^{\rm 10}$ Have you not even read this Scripture: 'The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief cornerstone.
- ¹¹ This was the Lord's doing, And it is marvelous in our eyes'?"
- ¹² And they sought to lay hands on Him, but feared the multitude, for they knew He had spoken the parable against them. So they left Him and went away.
- ¹³ Then they sent to Him some of the Pharisees and the Herodians, to catch Him in His words.


Jus gladii


- In Genesis 49:10, Jacob prophesied of the royal tribe of Judah: "The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor a lawgiver from between his feet, until Shiloh come; and unto him shall the gathering of the people be."
- Jews lost jus gladii [literally, "the right of the sword" (capital punishment)] in AD 6, when their land became a Roman province under Roman procurator Coponius.
- Many non-citizen Jews like Stephen were killed on religious grounds by Jews in the Roman Empire between AD 6 and 70.
- Allowing for abuses, it would seem that in her provinces Rome kept the ius gladii jealously within the hands of her appointed officials, regulating even their lawful use of it somewhat carefully. It seems almost inconceivable that the Sanhedrin alone could have executed [people] legally.

















- ¹³ Then they sent to Him some of the Pharisees and the Herodians, to catch Him in His words.
- ¹⁴ When they had come, they said to Him, "Teacher, we know that You are true, and care about no one; for You do not regard the person of men, but teach the way of God in truth. Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?
- ¹⁵ Shall we pay, or shall we not pay?" But He, knowing their hypocrisy, said to them, "Why do you test Me? Bring Me a denarius [penny] that I may see it."
 - ¹⁶ So they brought it. And He said to them, "Whose image and inscription is this?" They said to Him, "Caesar's."



¹⁷ And Jesus answered and said to them, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." And they marveled at Him.

- ¹⁸ Then some Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to Him; and they asked Him, saying:
- ¹⁹ "Teacher, Moses wrote to us that if a man's brother dies, and leaves his wife behind, and leaves no children, his brother should take his wife and raise up offspring for his brother.
- ²⁰ Now there were seven brothers. The first took a wife; and dying, he left no offspring. ²¹ And the second took her, and he died; nor did he leave any offspring. And the third likewise. [Levirite marriage]
- ²² So the seven had her and left no offspring. Last of all the woman died also. ²³ Therefore, in the resurrection, when they rise, whose wife will she be? For all seven had her as wife."

[HEH, HEH, HEH! We've got Him this time!]

²⁴ Jesus answered and said to them, "Are you not therefore mistaken, because you do not know the Scriptures nor the power of God? ²⁵ For when they rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven.

- ²⁶ But concerning the dead, that they rise, have you not read in the book of Moses, in the burning bush passage, how God spoke to him, saying, 'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'?
- ²⁷ He is not the God of the dead, but the God of the living. You are therefore greatly mistaken."
- ²⁸ Then one of the scribes [a Pharisee] came, and having heard them reasoning together, perceiving that He had answered them well, asked Him, "Which is the first commandment of all?"
- ²⁹ Jesus answered him, "The first of all the commandments is: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one. ³⁰ And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' This is the first commandment. [Deuteronomy 6:4-5]
- ³¹ And the second, like it, is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' [Leviticus 19:18] There is no other commandment greater than these."

- ³² So the scribe said to Him, "Well said, Teacher. You have spoken the truth, for there is one God, and there is no other but He. ³³ And to love Him with all the heart, with all the understanding, with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love one's neighbor as oneself, is more than all the whole burnt offerings and sacrifices."
- ³⁴ Now when Jesus saw that he answered wisely, He said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." But after that no one dared question Him.
- ³⁵ Then Jesus answered and said, while He taught in the temple, "How is it that the scribes say that the Christ is the Son of David? ³⁶ For David himself said by the Holy Spirit: 'The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at My right hand, Till I make Your enemies Your footstool." ¹ ³⁷ Therefore David himself calls Him 'Lord'; how is He then his Son?" And the common people heard Him gladly.

Jews believed that the Messiah would be David's son (John 7:41-42), but the only way David's son could also be David's Lord would be if the Messiah were *God come in human flesh!* The answer, of course, is the virgin birth, etc.



³⁸ Then He said to them in His teaching, "Beware of the scribes, who desire to go around in long robes, love greetings in the marketplaces, ³⁹ the best seats in the synagogues, and the best places at feasts, ⁴⁰ who devour widows' houses, and for a pretense make long prayers. These will receive greater condemnation."

⁴¹ Now Jesus sat opposite the treasury and saw how the people put money into the treasury. And many who were rich put in much. ⁴² Then one poor widow came and threw in two mites*, which make a quadrans.

⁴³So He called His disciples to Himself and said to them, "Assuredly, I say to you that this poor widow has put in more than all those who have given to the treasury; ⁴⁴ for they all put in out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all that she had, her whole livelihood."

Mark 13 – The Olivet Discourse

¹ Then as He went out of the temple, one of His disciples said to Him, "Teacher, see what manner of stones and what buildings are here!" ² And Jesus answered and said to him, "Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone shall be left upon another, that shall not be thrown down."*





- ³ Now as He sat on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked Him privately, ⁴ "Tell us, when will these things be? And what will be the sign when all these things will be fulfilled?"
- ⁵ And Jesus, answering them, began to say: "Take heed that no one deceives you. ⁶ For many will come in My name, saying, 'I am He,' and will deceive many. ⁷ But when you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be troubled; for such things must happen, but the end is not yet.
- ⁸ "For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. And there will be earthquakes in various places, and there will be famines and troubles. These are the beginnings of sorrows. ⁹ But watch out for yourselves, for they will deliver you up to councils, and you will be beaten in the synagogues. You will be brought before rulers and kings for My sake, for a testimony to them.
- ¹⁰ "And the gospel must first be preached to all the nations."

- ¹¹ But when they arrest you and deliver you up, do not worry beforehand, or premeditate what you will speak. But whatever is given you in that hour, speak that; for it is not you who speak, but the Holy Spirit.
- ¹² Now brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child; and children will rise up against parents and cause them to be put to death. ¹³ And you will be hated by all for My name's sake. But he who endures to the end shall be saved.
- ¹⁴ "So when you see the 'abomination of desolation,' spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing where it ought not" (let the reader understand), "then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains.
- ¹⁵ Let him who is on the housetop not go down into the house, nor enter to take anything out of his house. ¹⁶ And let him who is in the field not go back to get his clothes.
- ¹⁷ But woe to those who are pregnant and to those who are nursing babies in those days!

- ¹⁸ And pray that your flight may not be in winter. ¹⁹ For in those days there will be tribulation, such as has not been since the beginning of the creation which God created until this time, nor ever shall be.
- ²⁰ And unless the Lord had shortened those days, no flesh would be saved; but for the elect's sake, whom He chose, He shortened the days.
- ²¹ Then if anyone says to you, 'Look, here is the Christ!' or, 'Look, He is there!' do not believe it. ²² For false christs and false prophets will rise and show signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect.
- ²³ But take heed; see, I have told you all things beforehand.*
- ²⁴ "But in those days, after that tribulation, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; ²⁵ the stars of heaven will fall, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken.

- ²⁶ Then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory.
- ²⁷ And then He will send His angels, and gather together His elect from the four winds, from the farthest part of earth to the farthest part of heaven.
- ²⁸ "Now learn this parable from the fig tree: When its branch has already become tender, and puts forth leaves, you know that summer is near.
- ²⁹ So you also, when you see these things happening, know that it is near--at the doors!
- ³⁰ Assuredly, I say to you, this generation will by no means pass away till all these things take place. ³¹ Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away.
- ³² "But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.

- ³³ Take heed, watch and pray; for you do not know when the time is.
- ³⁴ It is like a man going to a far country, who left his house and gave authority to his servants, and to each his work, and commanded the doorkeeper to watch.
- ³⁵ Watch therefore, for you do not know when the master of the house is coming--in the evening, at midnight, at the crowing of the rooster, or in the morning--
- ³⁶ lest, coming suddenly, he find you sleeping.
- ³⁷ And what I say to you, I say to all: Watch!"
