

PSALM 119

About the Psalms

- A "psalm" is a composition set to music. The psalms were written largely with a view to instrumental musical accompaniment.
- They were written over 1,000 years from Moses (1500 BC) to Ezra (450 BC), whom the LXX credited with Psalms 1 and 119.
- "Selah" means a pause (pause to reflect, musical pause); it is not to be spoken.
- There are over four hundred quotations or allusions to the psalms in the New Testament.
- Many were acrostics (initial letter of each succeeding verse is in alphabetical order) such as Psalms 9, 10, 25, 34, 37, 111, 112, 119, 145.





- An important theme is the person and work of Jesus Christ. Many psalms are messianic (2, 8, 9, 16, 22, 24, 31, 41, 45, 46, 67, 69, 72, 89, 93, 110, 118, 132).
- All 26 verses in Psalm 136 end with the same words: "for his mercy endureth forever."
- The last five psalms (146-150) are called the "Hallelujah Psalms"; they begin and end with, "Praise ye the LORD" or, in the Hebrew, "Hallelujah!"


 The five groups of psalms correspond with the five books of Moses.

Understanding Psalms

1. The Psalms are written in a poetic style. Some one-third of the Bible is poetic.



Hebrew poetry is characterised by brevity in line length, parallelism and figurative language.

- 2. Psalms fall into particular literary genres.
 - a. Laments are the most common genre.
 - **b. Praise psalms** praise God as Creator for His greatness and goodness.
 - c. Thanksgiving psalms joyfully express gratitude.
 - d. Kinship/covenant psalms affirm loyalty to God.
 - e. Songs of trust in times of danger.
 - **f.** Wisdom psalms focus on the blessings of God's Word.
- 3. The historical setting of a psalm is important to understand the psalm. But don't overdo it.


4. Lyric poetry like Psalms have a 3-part structure:

- a. The subject is usually set out in the first few verses. The controlling themes are found here.
- b. Development of the subject is the main part of the psalm. Various authors generally develop their subject in four ways:
 - 1) Contrast (e.g., between the righteous and the wicked)
 - 2) Listing items associated with the subject.
 - 3) Using **relationships** (e.g., the majesty of God).
 - **4) Repetition**, using various images to develop the theme.
- c. A psalm is rounded off by the conclusion. This might be a summary or a prayer.

5. There's more to structure than just 3-parts:

- a. Descriptive structure describes an event, scene or person.
- b. Expository structure unfolds ideas or emotions.
- c. Narrative structure presents a series of events.
- d. Dramatic structure; a speaker address a listener.
- e. Emotional structure reflects abrupt changes from one subject to another, showing emotions.
- f. Repetitive structures present a theme in differing ways.
- g. Logical structures sequence ideas to a conclusion.
- h. Catalogue structures list various aspects of a subject.

- 6. Psalm 119, it functions in Book V as a bridge between two well-defined cycles:
 - a. the Egyptian Hallel (113-118) chanted in the temple whilst the Passover lambs were slain.
 - b. the Songs of Ascents (Degrees) (120-134) sung by captives returning from Babylon, pilgrim caravans, travellers and at feasts.

The overall structure of Psalm 119

- The main theme of Psalm 119 occurs halfway through, at Psalm 119:89: "LORD, your word is settled in heaven forever."
- Not surprisingly, Psalm 119 is structured in the menorah (chiasma) pattern common to biblical Hebrew poetry.

Wisdom teaching: the way of the Book is the preferred way

Expressing his lament, the psalmist says, "Keep me alive"

Prayers to YHWH as master teacher; intensifies interiority

Privilege of servitude-God's will as moral obedience

Prayer as free-will offering and fidelity in life or in death





PSALM 1

A SHOWPIECE OF BIBLICAL COMPOSITION

- ¹ Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful.
- ² But his delight is in the law of the LORD; and in his law doth he meditate day and night.
- ³ And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.

Analysis of Psalm 1

- Psalm 1 is a wisdom psalm that introduces the book of Psalms. It points the way to blessing and warns about divine judgment.
- Psalm 1 contrasts a divine view of the godly and the ungodly, with the indentations showing how the godly and ungodly are viewed. Despite the apparent equal focus on the ungodly, they are only used as a foil. The overall message emphasizes that godly living has God's approval.
- Bible history seems to be built around the concept of "two men".
