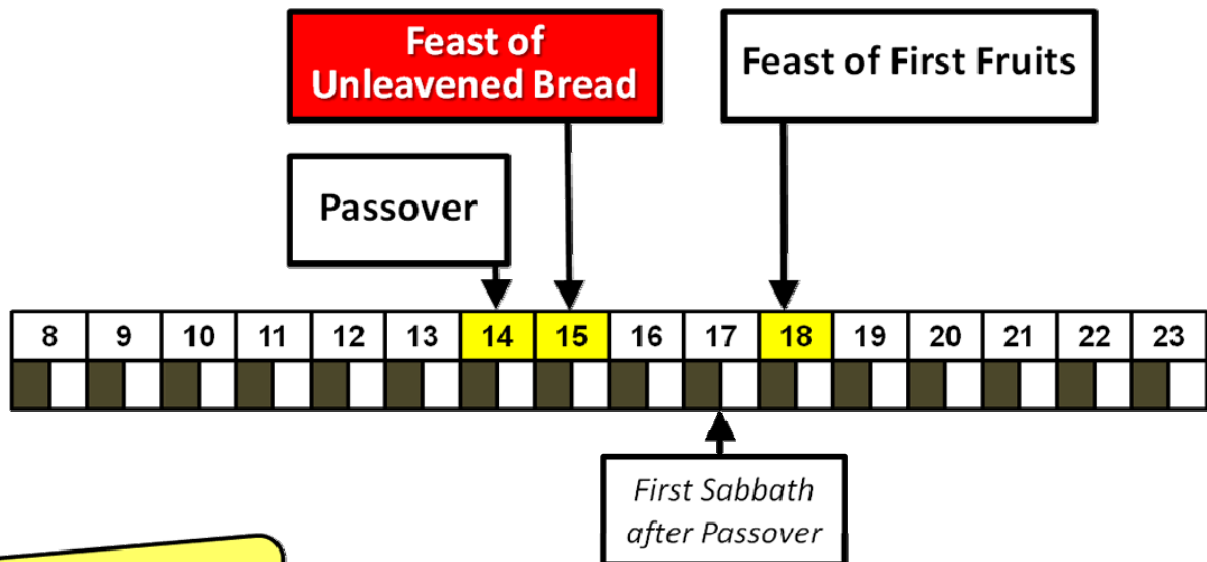
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# The Spring Feasts (1<sup>st</sup> Month: Nisan)



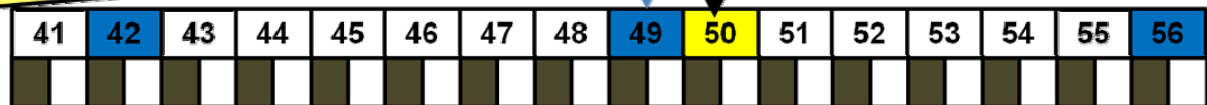

## The Feast of Weeks

**Feast of Weeks  
Shavout**

- Pentecost = 50 weeks
- "Counting the Omer" (49 + 1 days). Always on a Sunday.
- Only use of Leavened Bread! Two loaves (Jew & Gentile?)
- Prophetic: The Birth of the Church—Feast of Pentecost (Acts 2).

Seventh Sabbath plus 1 day →



- Jews believe that Enoch was born on Shavout and was removed on his birthday.
- The church was born on Shavout.
