

Theology underpinning the book of Acts

While Acts is written as straightforward history, understanding some theology can be useful.

- 1. Key subjects in Acts include God, Jesus, and Holy Spirit.
- 2. Salvation is available to **everyone** (Jews and Gentiles).
- 3. Jews (OT) and Followers of Jesus' Way (NT) have **separate identities and futures**, but are both included in God's Plan.
- 4. The ekklesia (aka "church") is the Body of Believers, not a religion, denomination or building.
- 5. **Revelations** regarding the "mystical church" of Christ:
 - a. Jesus Christ created the church. He is its origin.
 - b. The church is one with Jesus Christ. He is its **nature**.
 - c. The function of the church is to be the **instrument** of Jesus:
 - To impart life where there is death
 - To manifest **light** where there is darkness
 - To produce **love** where there is apathy, bitterness and hatred.
- 6. **Enemies/antagonists** of the *ekklesia*:
 - a. **Prejudice** (prejudging, no confidence, playing "church").
 - b. **Personal agendas** (desire for other than God's will).
 - c. **Pride** (lack of obedience to the Holy Spirit).
- 7. **Lessons** for the corporate *ekklesia* (Body of Christ):
 - a. The church's **passion** must be the glory of God.
 - b. The church's **governing principle** must be loyalty to Christ.
 - c. The church's **power** must be the Holy Spirit.
- 8. Challenges for Believers arising from the book of Acts:
 - a. What is your **motivation**? Why be a Follower?
 - b. What is your **method**? How does one follow Jesus?
 - c. What is your emphasis? Why do you follow Him?

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- 9. Baptism with the Spirit:
 - a. **Baptism with the Spirit** of Jesus began **Jesus' earthly ministry** (Luke 3:21-22).
 - b. Baptism with the Spirit of disciples began Jesus' heavenly ministry (Acts 2:1-4).
- 10. Sign gifts: speaking with tongues (unlearned languages), healing, etc:
 - a. Charismatics see sign gifts as primarily edification.
 - b. Non-charismatics see sign gifts as a means of authenticating revelation.

In Acts, the focus is on speaking in <u>unlearned languages</u>:

11. And Peter said to them, **repent**, and be **baptized** every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. (Acts 2:38)

REPENT

Change of mind and heart

(Hebrew word means to turn around, as in from your back to Jesus to facing Jesus)

or

Change of conduct*

BAPTISE

Spirit baptism

(This is solely God's prerogative.)

or

Water baptism:

- Is water baptism a requirement**
- OR an expression of faith***

Notes:

- * Turning from sinful practices (personal reform) is works, **not** faith. True faith brings real repentance, which leads to appropriate changes in conduct.
- ** If Baptism is required for salvation, salvation is of *works*, **not** *faith*. Over 100 New Testament verses make faith in Christ the **only** condition for justification.
- *** New Testament apostles simply seemed to take for granted that all who trusted in Christ would then submit to water baptism.
