




What is (treasure) Trove?

Trove has four basic functions:

- It aggregates collections from around 800 research, cultural heritage and community organisations. All Australian universities contribute data to Trove.
- It hosts digital collections both digitised newspapers and other types of digitised content particularly journals and books.
- 3. It provides a platform to research and build data collections

 with some basic tools in the interface and a number of
 Application Programming Interfaces (APIs) to make the data
 freely available.
- 4. It's a community of people who research, make connections, provide content, and correct and enrich the data for others.

From January 1788, when the First Fleet of convicts arrived at Botany Bay, to the end of convict transportation 80 years later, over 160,000 convicts were transported to Australia.

Although convicts were transported to the colonies of New South Wales, Tasmania and Western Australia, many convicts ended up in other states or colonies, having been taken there by their assigned masters or by moving there after gaining their freedom. Distant settlements such as Moreton Bay and Norfolk Island were also used

The First Fleet

The eleven ships which arrived on 26 January 1788 are known as the First Fleet. They carried around 1400 convicts, soldiers and free people.

The journey from England to Australia took 252 days and there were around 48 deaths on the voyage.

RIP Joyce RYERSON died 30 August 2012, aged 95



The Ryerson Index is a free index to death notices appearing in Australian newspapers. The date range covered extends from the *Sydney Gazette* of 1803 up to newspapers published within the last week or so. The Index also includes many funeral notices, and some probate notices and obituaries.

Because the Index was originally created by the Sydney Dead Persons Society, its strength lies in notices from NSW papers - including in excess of two million notices from the *Sydney Morning Herald* alone. However, the representation from papers from other states continues to grow, with additional papers being regularly added, so that the Index can now truly be considered an Australian index.

Indexing is being continuously carried out by a team of volunteers, too numerous to mention individually, who give freely of their time to ensure the site continues to grow. Site updates generally occur weekly.

The index itself cannot by definition be considered a primary source of data, but is purely a research aid to direct the researcher to the original source of a notice. We at Ryerson cannot undertake genealogical research for you, we are too busy indexing!
