






God's Wrath on Unrighteousness

¹⁸ For the wrath of God is [being] revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, ¹⁹ because what may be known of God is manifest in them, for God has shown *it* to [*or* in] them.



²⁰ For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse, ²¹ because, although they knew God, they did not glorify *Him* as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened.



²² Professing to be wise, they became fools, ²³ and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things.

²⁴ Therefore God also gave them up to uncleanness, in the lusts of their hearts, to dishonor their bodies among themselves, ²⁵ who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen [so let it be].



²⁶ For this reason God gave them up to vile passions. For even their women exchanged the natural use for what is against nature.

²⁷ Likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust for one another, men with men committing what is shameful, and receiving in themselves the penalty of their error which was due.

God's Righteous Judgment

2 Therefore you are inexcusable, O man, whoever you are who judge, for in whatever you judge another you condemn yourself; for you who judge practice the same things. ² But we know that the judgment of God is according to truth against those who practice such things.

¹¹ For there is no partiality with God.

- ¹² For as many as have sinned without law will also perish without law, and as many as have sinned in the law will be judged by the law
- ¹³ for not the hearers of the law *are* just in the sight of God, but the doers of the law will be justified;
- (for when Gentiles, who do not have the law, by nature do the things in the law, these, although not having the law, are a law to themselves,
- ¹⁵ who show the work of the law written in their hearts, their conscience also bearing witness, and between themselves *their* thoughts accusing or else excusing *them*)
- ¹⁶ in the day when God will judge the secrets of men by Jesus Christ, according to my gospel.

The Jews Guilty as the Gentiles

 ¹⁷ Indeed you are called a Jew, and rest on the law, and make your boast in God,
 ¹⁸ and know *His* will, and approve the things that are excellent, being instructed out of the law,

1. Being called a Jew;

- 2. Reliance on the Law;
- 3. Boasting of God;
- 4. Knowing God's will;
- 5. Instructed (in the minutia) of the Law.

The Jews Guilty as the Gentiles

¹⁷ Indeed you are called a Jew, and rest on the law, and make your boast in God, ¹⁸ and know *His* will, and approve the things that are excellent, being instructed out of the law, ¹⁹ and are confident that you yourself are a guide to the blind, a light to those who are in darkness, 20 an instructor of the foolish, a teacher of babes, having the form of knowledge and truth in the law.

²¹ You, therefore, who teach another, do you not teach yourself?

You who preach that a man should not steal, do you steal?

22 You who say, "Do not commit adultery," do you commit adultery?

You who abhor idols, do you rob temples?

- ²³ You who make your boast in the law, do you dishonor God through breaking the law?
- ²⁴ For "the name of God is blasphemed among the Gentiles because of you," as it is written. [Isaiah 52:5 (LXX); Eze. 36:20]

Circumcision of No Avail

²⁵ For circumcision is indeed profitable if you keep the law; but if you are a breaker of the law, your circumcision has become uncircumcision.

²⁶ Therefore, if an uncircumcised man keeps the righteous requirements of the law, will not his uncircumcision be counted as circumcision?



²⁷ And will not the physically uncircumcised, if he fulfills the law, judge you who, even with your written code and circumcision, are a transgressor of the law?

²⁸ For he is not a Jew who *is one* outwardly, nor is circumcision that which *is* outward in the flesh; ²⁹ but *he is* a Jew who *is one* inwardly; and circumcision *is that* of the heart, in the Spirit, not in the letter; whose praise *is* not from men but from God.

God's Judgment Defended

3 What advantage then has the Jew, or what *is* the profit of circumcision? ² Much in every way! Chiefly because to them were committed the oracles of God. ³ For what if some did not believe? Will their unbelief make the faithfulness of God without effect? ⁴ Certainly not! Indeed, let God be true but every man a liar. As it is written:

"That You may be justified in Your words, And may overcome when You are judged." [Psalm 51:4]



Man is unjust, but God is just; And finally justice will triumph.

- ⁵ But if our unrighteousness demonstrates the righteousness of God, what shall we say? *Is* God unjust who inflicts wrath? (I speak as a man.) ⁶ Certainly not! For then how will God judge the world?
- ⁷ For if the truth of God has increased through my lie to His glory, why am I also still judged as a Sinner? ⁸ And why not say, "Let us do evil that good may come"?—as we are slanderously reported and as some affirm that we say. Their condemnation is just.

All Have Sinned

⁹ What then?

Are we better than they?

Not at all.

For we have previously charged both Jews and Greeks that they are all under sin.



 A ¹³ "Their throat <i>is</i> B an open tomb; B' With their tongues A they have practiced deceit"; C "The poison of asps <i>is</i> D under their lips"; D'¹⁴ "Whose mouth <i>is</i> C' full of cursing and bitterness." 	Whatever we do we cannot escape the "worthlessness" of the righteousness that we bring from our fallen nature.

- ¹⁵ "Their feet *are* swift to shed blood;
- ¹⁶ Destruction and misery *are* in their ways;
- ¹⁷ And the way of peace they have not known."
- ¹⁸ "There is no fear of God before their eyes."



¹⁹ Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God.



²⁰ Therefore by the deeds of the law no flesh will be justified in His sight, for by the law *is* the knowledge of sin.

The Message So Far

1. People are accountable to God.

Humanity is not autonomous. It is God who created the world and everything in it. As creator, God has the right to demand that we worship Him.

2. The main human problem is rebellion against God.

We did not honor God and give thanks to Him. Our foolish hearts were darkened and we "exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images resembling mortal man and birds and animals and creeping things". "Therefore we have no excuse!" This paves the way for the good news. But good news isn't good news unless we know we need to be saved.

3. God's solution to humanity's sin is Jesus' death and resurrection.

Having laid out the bad news, Paul turns now to the good news, the *gospel* of Jesus Christ. "But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law." Through Christ's sacrificial death and resurrection sinners may be saved from the condemnation our sins deserve. Despite our rebellion against God, we can be "justified by the gift of His grace."

4. Salvation comes through faith in Jesus Christ.

How is that good news for me? Paul will tell us in Chapters 3 and 4. The salvation God has provided comes "through faith in Jesus Christ," and it is "for all who believe." Faith is counted as righteousness.
