
- "I am not ashamed of the [origin, operation, outcome, or outreach of the] gospel."



Man is unjust, but God is just; And finally justice will triumph.






6 What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? ² Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it?












⁹ knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, dies no more.


- ¹¹ Likewise you also, reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
- Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body, that you should above it in its lusts




¹³ And do not present your members as instruments of unrighteousness to sin, but present yourselves to God as being alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God. 14 For sin shall not have eminioniovenyou u are not uneer la but under grace.


¹⁵ What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? Certainly not! ¹⁶ Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin *leading* to death, or of obedience *leading* to righteousness?





¹⁹I speak in human *terms* because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you presented your members *as* slaves of uncleanness, and of lawlessness *leading* to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves of righteousness for holiness.













Freed From the Law







The law only has authority on the living!


For the woman who has a husband is bound by the law to her husband as long as he lives.

What is Romans 7:2-3 Really About?



- A married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives.
- If she is joined to another man while her husband lives, she is an adulteress.
- If her husband dies, she is released from the law concerning husbands.
- And she is free from the law to be joined to another man.



The Allegory of Romans 7:2-3



- People are under authority of sin while sin is alive in their lives.
- Once faith comes, sin is confronted and revealed as sin, giving a choice.
- Man dies to sin; Grace regenerates her heart, producing life in the Spirit.
- Freed from bondage of sin; the Bride of Christ becomes justified and the beloved of God.



BRIDE NEW HUSBAND (MANKIND) (CHRIST)



- ⁴ Therefore, my brethren, you also have become dead to the law through the body of Christ, that you may be married to another—to Him who was raised from the dead, that we should bear fruit to God.
- ⁵ For when we were in the flesh, the sinful passions which were aroused by the law were at work in our members to bear fruit to death.

⁶ But now we have been delivered from the law, having died to what we were held by, so that we should serve in the newness of the Spirit and not in the oldness of the letter.

Letter of the Law


- Depends on the flesh (Rom 8:3)
- Produces rebellion (Rom 7:8)
- Results in more sin (Rom 5:20)
- Brings wrath (Rom 4:15)
- Not of faith (Gal 3:12)
- Kills(2 Cor 3:4-6; Gal 3:21)

- Depends upon God's power (Luke 23:49; Acts 1:8)


Sin's Advantage in the Law

⁷ What shall we say then? *Is* the law sin?



Certainly not!

On the contrary, I would not have known sin except through the law.



⁸ But sin, taking opportunity by the commandment, produced in me all *manner of evil* desire. For apart from the law sin *was* dead.

⁹ I was alive once without the law, but when the commandment came, sin revived and I died.






¹⁰ And the commandment, which was to bring life, I found to bring death.

¹¹ For sin, taking occasion by the commandment, deceived me, and by it killed *me*.



"THEREFORE THE LAW IS
HOLY
AND THE COMMANDMENT
HOLY AND JUST
AND GOOD."

12 Therefore the law is holy, and the commandment holy and just and good.



Law Cannot Save From Sin

But sin, that it might appear sin, was producing death in me through what is good, so that sin through the commandment might become exceedingly sinful.



"By the commandment sin became exceedingly sinful."

¹⁴ For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin. ¹⁵ For what I am doing, I do not understand.

For what I will to do, that I do not practice; but what I hate, that I do.

¹⁶ If, then, I do what I will not to do, I agree with the law that it is good. ¹⁷ But now, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me.



Help! I know that I have been regenerated and born again, but the Law shows me that I *still* sin. I don't want to, and I try not to, but I still sin

and I hate it:

Despite my best intentions, the sin in me sometimes overwhelms them.

¹⁸ For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh) nothing good dwells; for to will is present with me, but *how* to perform what is good I do not find. ¹⁹ For the good that I will *to do*, I do not do; but the evil I will not *to do*, that I practice.






Free From Indwelling Sin

8 There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit.




² For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death.



For what the law could not do in that it was weak through the flesh, God did by sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, on account of sin: He condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. ⁵ For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit.






⁹ But you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he is not His.

¹⁰ And if Christ is in you, the body *is* dead because of sin, but the Spirit *is* life because of righteousness.

Sonship Through the Spirit

¹² Therefore, brethren, we are debtors—not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. ¹³ For if you live according to the flesh you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live.



¹⁴ For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons [children] of God.



For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father."

¹⁶ The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷ and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him, that we may also be glorified together.

From Suffering to Glory

¹⁸ For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us.





- Romans 8:18 -

¹⁹ For the earnest expectation of the creation eagerly waits for the revealing of the sons of God. ²⁰ For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected *it* in hope; ²¹ because the creation itself also will be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God.



For we know that the whole creation groans and labors with birth pangs together until now.



²³ Not only *that,* but we also who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, eagerly waiting for the adoption, the redemption of our body.



²⁴ For we were saved in this hope, but hope that is seen is not hope; for why does one still hope for what he sees?

²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we eagerly wait for *it* with perseverance.

- Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.
- ²⁷ Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit *is*, because He makes intercession for the saints according to *the will of* God.

THE SPIRITOR COL

The Holy Spirit Intercedes For Us Romans 8:26, 27

²⁸ And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose.



²⁹ For whom He foreknew, He also predestined *to be* conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. ³⁰ Moreover whom He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified.
